When you surrender your life to Christ, you give up the home in this world and you receive a new home with Christ. The darkness you lived in as a citizen of this world should cease. Your new identity is found in Jesus Christ. He should begin to take over your life. You should think, sound, talk, and act like Christ. You should form into the image of Jesus Christ. As a citizen of Christ, you have a peace and joy that never existed as a citizen of this world. You can rest in the presence of Jesus.

The clock is ticking. Time is running out. Do you want to live in the dark and be a citizen of this dying world or do you want to live in the light and live as a citizen of Christ?
